

Mount Washington Cog Railway

Thursday, September 24, 2015



EVENT: All aboard! Come aboard the Cog Railroad, the world's first mountain climbing train, the only Cog Railway east of the Rockies, to the top of Mount Washington, the tallest peak in New England. Passengers will enjoy beautiful panoramic views from the top of Mount Washington. On clear days, you will be able to see peaks in Vermont, New Hampshire, north of the border into Canada and east to the Atlantic Ocean. Although we will be traveling above the tree line, you will be able to look back to the valleys of the White Mountains to enjoy some beautiful fall foliage. Visitors will delight in exploring the mountain-top community which includes the Sherman Adams Visitor Center, Mount Washington's Observatory's Weather Museum and 1853 Tip Top House. You can also send a post card from the top of Mount Washington or get your picture taken at the summit marker.

Please Note: Walking on uneven, steep terrain or sometimes slippery ground may be required. Please pack warm clothes as the summit will be much cooler than our initial ascend.

There is no designated stop for lunch on this trip. Please pack a lunch with you to eat on the van either before our ride or for the way home. There is a small snack bar at the summit if you'd prefer to buy something there.

<u>DATE:</u> The date selected is Thursday, September 24, 2015. We will depart the Exeter Recreation Center parking lot at 7:15am and will be returning to Exeter approximately 4:30pm.

COST: The cost of the tour includes your ticket aboard the Cog Railroad and transportation in the Recreation Department Van.
