Organization Overview:

AIDS Response Seacoast (ARS) is a non-profit, community-based HIV/AIDS Service Organization dedicated to providing direct assistance, education, and advocacy for persons living with and affected by HIV/AIDS. ARS provides services to clients at all stages of HIV infection that live in Rockingham and Strafford counties in New Hampshire, as well as providing educational programs throughout New Hampshire. It is the mission of ARS to support and assist those infected and affected by HIV/AIDS in maintaining a high quality of life through direct assistance and advocacy, and to prevent the spread of new infections by promoting safer practices and education for local and regional communities. ARS also works to put an end to myths and stereotypes about HIV/AIDS, and to provide a haven for folks to talk openly about HIV/AIDS, and to increase and diversify the network of HIV/AIDS related service providers in the communities we serve. Through various strategic planning groups and state committees, ARS plays an active role in trying to affect policy decisions made in local and state government regarding people living with HIV/AIDS and the funding needed to support them.

ARS is the only AIDS service organization serving Rockingham and Strafford Counties and we have been doing so since 1987.

Program Highlights:

ARS provides case management for people living with HIV/AIDS who live in Rockingham and Strafford Counties. Case managers at ARS provide direct face to face meetings, phone support, a multitude of medical & social referrals which include, but are not limited to referrals to needed services as identified by the client's assessments and individual service planning, i.e., Medicaid, Medicare, Fuel Assistance, Section 8 Housing, etc. Within this process, a client's needs and goals are assessed, and an individual service plan is developed in collaboration with the client to attain his/her goals. A case manager coordinates this process by providing information, advocacy, and referrals linking clients to primary and specialty health care, dental, mental health, and the NH DHHS CARE program HIV Drug Assistance Programs (HDAP) which provides access to life saving medications and medical care.

In addition, ARS provides support services which include emergency rent and utility assistance, medical transportation and a food pantry.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY

- Our most recent completed audited financials (FY 2023) reflect net assets of \$155,768.
 Available upon request. Our FY2024 audit is pending and will reflect net assets of \$162,464.
- The agency maintains a prudent financial reserve of \$100,386 as of June 30, 2024
- The agency maintains a line of credit in the amount of \$35,000 which has been unnecessary to draw on for over 16 years.
- A majority of agency grant funding comes from "cost-reimbursement" sources which means agency funds must first be spent before being compensated, with up to a 60-day turn-around time.
- The agency's Board of Directors is a hands-on body which brings in approximately 7% of agency revenue through fundraising activities and events. These monies help supplement grant revenue. Approximately 4% of agency funds are allocated to cover management and general expenses.
